

Wrist Worms with cable



Simple wrist worms with a decorative cable that suits both the beginner and the more experienced knitter.

They are a quick knit and are excellent as gift, because no one can ever get to many wrist worms!

Yarn: Drops silk alpaca, 80g.

The amount of yarn can be varied by changing the cuff length.

My wrist worms are knitted in color 7403.

Needles: 5mm (US 8)dpns and a cable needle.

Size: The ribbing makes the wrist worm flexible, but I think they are best

fitted if your wrist measures 16-17cm (6-7 inches). If you want to make them smaller or larger it's easy to add or remove four stitches from the ribbing part.

Other materials needed: A piece of scrap yarn and a sewing needle.

Abbreviations:

CO: Cast on

Sts: Stitch

R: row

K: knit

P: purl

Here's how you do:

Cast on 31 st on two needles. Then pull out one of them and divide the stitches over 3 needles like this: 10 st, 13 st, 8 st. The cable is knit over 13 stitches. I think it's easiest to keep them on the same needle.

r1: [k2, p2] 2 times, k2, p2, k9, p2, [k2, p2] 2 times.

r2: Worked as row 1.

r3: [k2, p2] 2 times, k2, p2, slip next 3sts to cable needle and hold to back of work, k3, k3 from cable needle, k3, p2, [k2, p2] 2 times.

r4-6: Worked as row 1.

r7: [k2, p2] 2 times, k2, p2, k3, slip next 3 sts to cable needle and hold to front of work, k3, k3 from cable needle, p2, [k2, p2] 2 times.

r8: worked as row 1.

Repeat row 1-8 until the work measure 20cm, or desired length.

Put 5sts on scrap yarn, I did it 3sts in from the cable. CO 5sts and continue in pattern. (This will be the thumb but you will knit that later on).

Cast off when the pattern measures 26cm, or desired length.

Cast off like this: knit the first stitch,

*knit the next stitch, pass the first stitch over the second. Repeat from *. Be sure to cast off loosely.

Thumb: pick up the 5 sts from the scrap yarn. Pick up 7 more sts and divide evenly on 3 needles. *k2, p2* for 6 rows. Cast off.

Knit one more, placing the hole for the thumb on the other side of the braid.

Weave in all ends. Done!
